RE: School attendance dues and voluntary financial contributions 2020

As a parent/caregiver, we appreciate that you had a choice on the school you selected for your child's/children education. We are honoured that you have chosen Marist Catholic School Herne Bay, and value the contribution you make to our special community.

Marist Catholic School, Herne Bay is different from other schools you may have considered:

- 1. First and foremost, we are a Catholic School and, as such, there is requirement from the Catholic Diocese to charge for the Special Character education provided;
- 2. As an integrated school, we do not charge fees in any way comparable with private schools. (~\$18k per annum);
- 3. As an integrated school, we do not receive the same level of government funding as public schools;
- 4. As a consequence of 3, we seek additional voluntary contributions from families to ensure we are providing your children with the best education possible.

Each year the Board of Trustees review the school fees. It is a challenging task to balance the increasing funding demands required to deliver a quality education for your children, with our desire to avoid putting undue financial pressure on families in our community.

After a detailed review, the Board of Trustees have agreed to set the total contribution for 2020 as follows::

- \$1,015 for the first child; and
- \$830 for any subsequent children of the same whanau enrolled at the school.

This fee contribution consists of the following components:

Family Assistance Fund	 Set by the MCSHB BoT In line with our values, this provides assistance to families who are experiencing financial difficulties Contribution can be increased if families so desire 	\$65 per family
