

## PROCEDURE: School Planning & Reporting

Marist Catholic School charter/strategic plan details our aims for the school, and our proposed methods for achieving them. Its ultimate aim is to provide the best learning outcomes for each student.

The board, principal, and teaching staff are responsible for developing the charter/strategic plan as its major policy statement, and the guiding document for the school. The principal, as manager of the school, is responsible for implementing it.

The board consults with the local Māori community when preparing or amending the charter/strategic plan, in accordance with the principles of te Tiriti o Waitangi and legal requirements under the Education and Training Act 2020.

The strategic plan documents how the school meets the National Education and Learning Priorities (NELPs) through its policies, plans, and programmes including those for <u>curriculum</u>, <u>assessment (aromatawai)</u>, and staff professional development.

The charter/strategic plan contains detailed information about:

- our values and vision
- our commitment to the principles of te Tiriti o Waitangi
- our strategic plan: aims, objectives, and priorities
- our long-term, and annual, targets and goals.

Student achievement data is reported to the board of trustees and the Ministry of Education as an analysis of variance in the annual report each year, as part of the school's implementation audits and reports.
