

MARIST CATHOLIC SCHOOL PROCEDURE: Food Safety

Marist Catholic Schools may provide food as part of a lesson, as treats, or on special occasions. Any food provided by Marist Catholic School is safe to eat. We meet food safety guidelines by:

- following recommended health guidelines for handwashing
- following the 3 Cs:
 - o Clean: preparing food in a hygienic environment
 - Cook: ensuring food is cooked properly
 - Chill: storing and transporting food appropriately
- taking extra care in hot weather and with high risk foods.

If the school sells food we may also be required to register as a national programme or to register a food control plan under the Food Act 2014.

If selling food for <u>fundraising</u> activities, we follow food and safety guidelines and register under the Food Act if required.
